We've been remodeling kitchens and bathrooms since 2007, and we've seen many different trends in this business. Below are some of the trends that have changed. If your kitchen is still rolling with looks like some of these, it might just be time to consider an upgrade!

SHORT KITCHEN BACKSPASHES

In the 80s and 90s, short backsplashes were installed and acceptable, but things have changed. A full-height or full-wall backsplash adds texture, details, character, and functionality (literally, protecting from splashes). Today, backsplashes can make a statement. Some possibilities for backsplashes include ceramic, porcelain, glass, natural stone or even the same material as the countertop (full height).

UNIFORM STAINED WOOD CABINERY

White cabinets and trim are timeless; kitchen remodels can be taken up a notch by creating subtle contrasts between wood, whites, and colors. One of the biggest trends we're seeing today is two-toned cabinets that offer a little bit more contrast and intrigue. This makes sense because people are naturally drawn to contrast.

APPLIANCE GARAGE ACCESSORY

These days, having a coffee maker or regularly used appliances out on your countertop isn't considered to be clutter. For those small appliances that you do want to hide away, consider using an empty cabinet. Appliance garages (once popular in years past) can take away from counter space which is often preferred, especially for multiple users in the kitchen.

DESKS & NICHES IN THE KITCHEN

Kitchen desks are not a great use of space and have been phased out due to lifestyle and technology changes. Today, people rely on cell phones and portable computers and are switching to paperless options. This dated fixed feature in the kitchen has been replaced with different storage options.

TILED COUNTERTOPS

Homeowners are replacing tiled countertops with slab solid surfaces. Gone away are the high maintenance grout joints.
